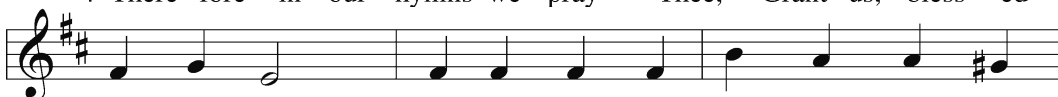
**Flowers:** Today’s flowers are given by Elaine Thompson, in honor of her and Phil’s 72<sup>nd</sup> Anniversary.

**Hymn of the month:** As an Easter Church, we are always joyful in the resurrection of our Lord, but during the season of Lent our joy is more restrained as the season focuses on penitence, or sorrow for sins. One of the ways we observe this is through the removal of ‘alleluia’s from the service. ‘Alleluia’ is a Hebrew phrase of joy that means ‘praise the Lord.’ ‘Alleluia, Song of Gladness,’ typically sung on Transfiguration Sunday, is a way to say goodbye to our ‘alleluias’ until Easter.

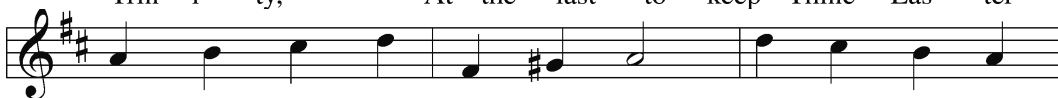
