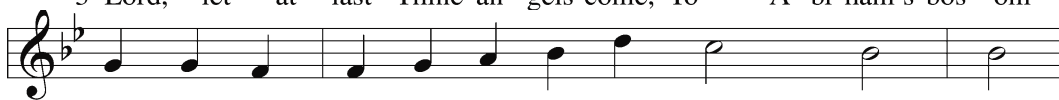

Hymn of the Month: Martin Schalling was a Lutheran pastor during the perilous times following the Smalkald wars when the Lutherans were defeated by the (Catholic) emperor, Charles V. This great hymn generates a holistic vision of Christian life in just three stanzas. The first stanza acknowledges our need for the Lord's presence and affirms our trust in His saving blood. Stanza two recognizes the Lord as the source of all good things and prays for a life that will, "glorify Thy lavish grace ... and serve my neighbor." In the last stanza, we fearlessly face death, even welcome it, anticipating the joy awaiting us. As we sing this hymn, we acknowledge our deepest fears and affirm that their resolution comes only from Christ.
